



2020 Election Options



Early in-person voting

Don't want to go to the polls? Don't trust mail-in voting? There's a better way.

Just show up at the voter registrar's office with your ID, as listed on back of this brochure. →
No photo required!

Lancaster registrar's office: 8311 Mary Ball Rd, Lancaster – on the lower level at the back of the old courthouse.

It's open from 8:30am to 4:30pm Monday through Friday, Sept. 18th to Oct. 31st, plus two Saturdays, Oct. 24th and Oct. 31st.

Fill out your ballot and deposit it right into the vote counter, just like on election day.

If you have already requested a mail-in ballot but would rather vote early in person, visit the voter registration section on the county's website, www.lancova.com to get Cancellation of Mailed Ballot Form and return it to the registrar's office before September 18th.

If you have already received a mail-in ballot, bring it with you to the registrar's office.

Curbside voting accommodated.

Mail in Voting

Voters who have requested an application to vote by mail will be mailed a ballot.

Ballots will be mailed to voters beginning September 18th.

Witness signatures will not be required on envelopes. Prepaid envelopes will be provided.

A secure drop box will be provided at the registrar's office for those not wanting to mail their ballots.

The registrar will attempt to contact voters whose return envelopes have not been correctly or completely filled out.

Please return ballots as early as possible to allow for this process.




Vote in person

Vote in person on Election Day, Nov. 3rd.


Voting precincts will be open from 6:00 am to 7:00 pm.

Drop boxes for mail in ballots will be available at precincts on election day.

Acceptable forms of ID

- Valid Virginia driver's license
- DMV issued ID
- Valid US Passport
- US Military ID
- Nursing home resident ID
- Valid Student ID issued by public or private high school or school of higher education
- Credit card displaying a photograph
- Current utility bill, bank statement, government check or paycheck containing name & address
- Any valid employee identification card containing a photograph
- Valid Tribal enrollment or other tribal ID
- Valid ID card issued by the Department of Elections
- A signed ID Confirmation Statement

"Valid" means the document is genuine and is not expired for more than twelve months, EXCEPT for a Virginia driver's license for which the expiration date should NOT be considered when determining its validity.
